RESPECT CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PLAYERS



Bromham United AFC takes responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game and undertake the FA's Respect Code of Conduct.

The club would ask members to observe the FA's Respect Code of Conduct for Players at all times.

When playing football, I will:

- Always play to the best of my ability
- Play fairly – I won't cheat, complain or waste time
- Respect my team-mates, the opposition team, the referee and my Coach
- Play by the rules, as directed by the referee
- Shake hands with the opposition team and referee at the end of the game
- Listen and respond to what my coach ask/tells me
- Talk to someone I trust or the Club Welfare Officer if I am unhappy about anything at the club.

We understand if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by the Club, County FA or the FA.

I may:

- Be required to apologise to my team-mates, the opposition, referee or Team Coach
- Receive a formal warning from the Coach or the Club Committee
- Be dropped or substituted
- Be suspended from training
- Be required to leave the club.

In addition, Bromham United AFC requests Players take care to:

- Always behave in an appropriate manner, and respect others.
- Listen and respond to what the Coach or other officials are saying, and accept decisions made by club officials.
- Talk to someone you trust, or the Club Welfare Officer, if unhappy about something at the club.
- Attend training and matches with appropriate clothing and equipment. Shin-pads are a requirement for all activities, and a drinks bottle is also advised. In winter months, players should attend with warm and waterproof layers and gloves and the correct footwear.
- Footwear is adequately maintained following matches or training and will be inspected by referees at every match; studs should be replaced where necessary.
- Make every effort to attend mid-week training sessions and weekend matches for the duration of the season and to notify the Coach within a reasonable time frame if they will be absent for a match or training session, including over half-term, Christmas and Easter holidays. Leagues may schedule some matches for the holiday periods, and a Coach must give four weeks' notice to the league to request a free weekend if many players are to be away.
- Inform the Coach as soon as possible if any contact details change during the season.
